

WATER CONSERVATION POLICY

POLICY E

The Board of Directors and management of RiverSouth Rural Water District has deemed it necessary to protect the health, safety and welfare of each water user by adopting the following water conservation policy.

PHASE I VOLUNTARY CONSERVATION

Each water user is asked to voluntarily conserve water. Conservation may include, limiting watering lawns and shrubs to designated times of the day or night. Such designated times will be reported to water users either through local radio, newspaper or television by RiverSouth. In addition, conservation measurers can include car washing, driveway washing, and prompt repair of all water leaks. Last reporting of any signs of leaks in RiverSouth's system is strongly encouraged.

PHASE II MODIFIED MANDATORY CONSERVATION

This phase will prohibit all lawn, shrub and plant watering, car washing, driveway washing and no filling of swimming pools. All water leaks of any kind will be promptly repaired. Violation of this Phase will result in a disconnect of any water user who has failed to observe and comply with Phase II or has failed to repair water leaks promptly. There will be no new water users connected to the RiverSouth water system during Phase II.

PHASE III MANDATORY CONSERVATION

Shall ban all outside water and all commercial and industrial use. The use of water for recreational uses, such as watering golf courses, filling or re-filling of swimming pools and the irrigation of crops will be prohibited. In the event of enactment of Phase III, the only use will be for domestic use, such as dwelling houses, apartments and for human consumption and use.
